Level 6A aims to familiarize your child with numbers up to 10 through counting pictures or dots and reading numbers.

Notes to Parents

Throughout Level 6A there are notes to aid you during your child's worksheet study. These notes are located at the bottom of selected worksheets.

When counting pictures or dots, your child does not need to say, for example, "one dog, two dogs, ..." but rather, should say, "one, two, ..."

It is important to become involved in your child's learning by demonstrating how to read the numbers or by reading the numbers together with him/her.

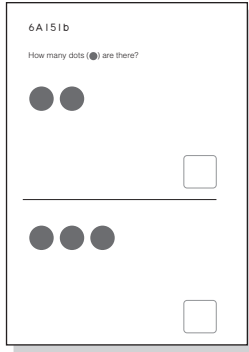
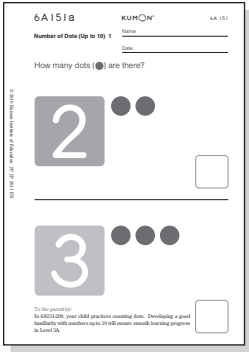
