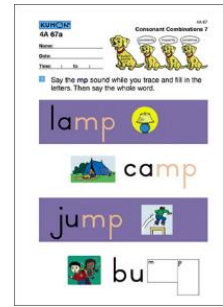


Kumon Reading Level 4A

Students continue to develop pre-reading skills by saying words with consonant blends, consonant digraphs, consonant controlled vowels and long vowels produced by silent e. Students still can use picture cues as hints to understand what the word means.

When completing the Kumon worksheets at home, please follow these steps:

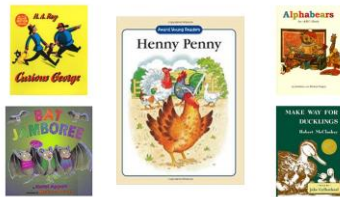


Do's	Don'ts
Let your child write their name, date, start time and end time on the 1 st page only.	Ask your child to blend the letters sounds that are not the focus of the worksheet set.
Read the directions aloud to your child.	Cover the picture and ask your child to guess or read the words.
*Always read "Attention Parents" Notes on the 1 st page of every set. *	Use the worksheets to teach another language.
Begin immediately after writing the start time.	Encourage your child to complete the worksheet without saying the focus sounds, words and sentences.
Make sure your child traces and copies the letters neatly with correct stroke order and the writing fits in the spaces given.	
Always have your child say the sound combinations aloud as he or she traces the letters.	
Always have your child say words and sentences aloud.	
Praise your child after he/she reads the words or sentences aloud.	
Let your child use the picture cues to recite the words if necessary.	
If your child doesn't know a word, use the "I say (parent), we say (together), you say (child)" rule.	
Praise your child when he/she has completed all the worksheets.	

*Attention Parents Notes: The notes on the "a" side of page 1, 11, 21, 31, 41, 51, 61, 71, 81, 91, 101, 111, 121, 131, 141, 151, 161 contain directions to help your child blend the focus sounds smoothly and say the words using picture cues or the repeating rule (I say, we say, you say).

Other tips to supplement Kumon at Home:

- Ask your Instructor for Kumon's Recommended Reading List and Read Aloud List! Ask for books that your child can practice on his or her own with your help.
- Read aloud your child with animation and expression.
- Read their favorite books over and over.
